

The IFS Programme aims to support excellent individual and collaborative research, to build the capability of early-career scientists in the developing world, and to contribute innovation to the sustainable management of biological, water and energy resources. In particular, to enable young scientists to contribute to a global research community that is aiming to reduce poverty and supporting sustainable development.

The primary focus remains the promotion of excellent science through early-career research grants and capability enhancing support to individual researchers in developing countries. INDIVIDUAL RESEARCH APPROACH

Throughout the coming decade the primary focus of IFS will be the promotion of excellent science through early career research grants and capability enhancing support to researchers in developing countries. We anticipate that the rigorous assessment of research proposals by experts will continue to provide international recognition to successful applicants and enhance opportunities for original individual research and scientific growth.

IFS believes that science holds the potential to transform the contemporary global challenge, not only to provide sufficient food, water and energy but also to ensure security of supply, at affordable cost and within acceptable limits of environmental change. IFS is aware that starvation, as well as water and energy deprivation is not addressed by increasing availability alone, but by securing entitlement to those commodities for 9 billion people. In the face of such a task there is a vital and powerful role for many creative, analytical minds across a broad array of research fields.

IFS recognises that the sustainable and equitable stewardship of global resources and the provision of services from them will draw on many technical and social fields of research relating to:

ELIGIBILITY FOR INDIVIDUAL RESEARCH APPROACH

Applicants for Individual IFS Research Grants:

- must be citizens of an eligible countries, and carry out their research in an eligible country (this does not have to be the country of citizenship)
 - » Eligible countries list
- must have a minimum of an MSc, MA or equivalent academic degree
- must be (for men) younger than 35 years of age, and (for women) younger 40 years of age [If the applicant's 35th (men)/40th (women) birthday is on the closing date of the call, he/she is still eligible.]


IFS has recognized the importance of support to individual researchers for nearly four decades and will continue to provide renewable individual grants. However, the interlinked development challenges that face humanity increasingly require scientists to work with each other, sometimes uniting different disciplines, different countries and regions. Therefore, through the phased introduction of a new collaborative research approach, the 2011-2020 Strategy will also provide support for researchers to combine strengths, expertise, and experience, to address a larger topic or a research issue including situations where more than one discipline is required. IFS believes that through collaborative research, early career scientists can learn new insights from each other, can develop new skills and eventually also gain access to different funding sources.

Through support and mentoring we aim to reduce possible barriers which may include:

- difficulties in finding appropriate working partners,
- reaching consensus and team building,
- clarification of intellectual property rights

- **Biological Resources in Terrestrial Systems**
This includes but is not limited to: research on biodiversity, forestry, animal production, crop science, underutilised species, natural products, renewable energy and climate variability, and technical research on all forms and aspects of food production; also, aspects of the social, economic, cultural and historical context for current and future practices, use and management of natural resources as well as the fostering of socio- economic resilience.
- **Water and Aquatic Resources**
This includes but is not limited to: water resources availability, conservation, use, and issues associated with water-related institutions; research on freshwater, brackish and marine aquatic organisms and their environments, as well as human and community access to such resources in the protection and improvement of their livelihoods.
- **Food Security, Dietary Diversity and Healthy Livelihoods**
This includes but is not limited to: research encompassing agricultural and livestock production systems including socio-economic and farming systems research, research on the conditions for the enjoyment of food security beyond food production, distribution and overall availability, and also research on access to food or resources for food for socio-economic resilience and improved livelihoods, health and well being in rural and urban areas.

Who We Are

Biodiversity is the variety of species on Earth (including all plants, animals, fungi, and micro-organisms) and is the very foundation of human existence. Biodiversity has provided humankind with healthy ecosystems, food, fiber, pharmaceuticals, pollination, and peace of mind for thousands of years.

IDEA WILD seeks to **minimize the loss of biodiversity by empowering people on the front lines of conservation** by awarding small equipment grants to conservation professionals around the world. These equipment grants advance biological research, conservation education, community outreach, conservation management, field training, and professional development in areas where it is needed most. By empowering both aspiring and veteran conservation professionals, IDEA WILD has been instrumental in establishing new protected areas, reversing the decline of species through innovative management plans, restoring damaged and critical habitat, and improving how local communities support and sustain their immediate natural resources.

Each year, IDEA WILD distributes over \$300,000 worth of equipment – including digital cameras, spotting scopes, mist nets, tents, binoculars, and GPS units – to over 400 conservation projects worldwide. IDEA WILD receives equipment requests daily and prioritizes these requests based on conservation impact, recipient need, and project location. Additional consideration is given to projects in areas identified as **critical biodiversity hotspots**. IDEA WILD focuses its support on professionals working in developing countries where other sources of support are limited or nonexistent, and where a \$750 equipment grant is often equivalent to several months' salary.

In over twenty years, IDEA WILD has developed a unique and effective model for empowering conservation and has successfully implemented it in areas of the world where it will have the most impact. IDEA WILD originally initiated equipment grants for conservation relief efforts in Mexico, Central America, Colombia, and Venezuela. Subsequently, IDEA WILD expanded its scope to include the Caribbean, Madagascar, Southeast Asia and numerous countries throughout Africa and South America. Since its inception in 1991, IDEA WILD has successfully supported over 4,500 conservation projects in over 100 countries. Because recipients pass on their equipment to at least two other conservation efforts, it is estimated that IDEA WILD has effectively served over 13,500 conservation projects around the globe.

 - A letter of recommendation from your advisor (only if you are a student)
 - If possible, please include a photo of the target species or habitat
- Your proposal must relate to biodiversity conservation, research or education.**
- For the IDEA WILD application form:**
 - A current email address is absolutely necessary so we can confirm arrival of your proposal, communicate after we have accepted or rejected your proposal, or ask additional questions.
 - Due to the uncertainty and cost of international shipping, IDEA WILD uses a relay method for delivering equipment. Please provide the name, United States address, email address and telephone number of a person (such as a visiting professor, friend or relative) who will be traveling to your country. We will mail your equipment to this person in the United States for them to deliver to you.
 - IDEA WILD encourages the use and reuse of equipment and gives preference to proposals that clearly explain how the equipment will be used when the project is finished.

With the adoption of the Strategic Plan for Biodiversity 2011-2020 and the Aichi Biodiversity Targets in the framework of the Convention on Biological Diversity, countries will have to formulate biodiversity indicators and gather data that will feed these.


One of the strategic objectives of the CEBioS programme is to improve the knowledge on the measurement, reporting and verification (MRV) of policy choices and activities linked to biodiversity and ecosystem services. We intend to work with our partner countries in the South on the development, assessment or implementation of indicators in the framework of their National Biodiversity Strategies. To that end, calls are launched annually in order to provide funding and guidance to our partner countries.
